The National Wildlife Federation (NWF) is planning to sponsor the Pecora IV Symposium. The topic will be "Wildlife preservation and related conservation studies."

Gene Thorley and I have met with NWF officials; they have traveled to Sioux Falls and engaged facilities at the Downtown Holiday Motel (October 9-11, 1978).

The pattern of organization that has emerged is a fluid one with a Reston-based scientist initially being the principal contact with the sponsoring association and transferring this responsibility to Sioux Falls as plans and program evolve. The timing of this transfer is judgmental but the fact remains that someone must be in charge and my recommendation is that it be someone in Reston.

I am not well acquainted with remote sensing activities in the wildlife/conservation field and have asked Gene Thorley to accept prime USGS responsibility for the Pecora IV Symposium. He has accepted, with the understanding that appropriate assistance will be given by wildlife/conservation specialists at EDC.
